Report on Seminar held on 10.12.2021

In course of academic pursuit, the department of English has organised a seminar on 10th December-2021 in the college Smart Class Room of this college on a course-related topic "R.K Narayan's The Man Eater of Malgudi; A Post Colonial Reading".

Prof. TusharKanti from the Department of English, M.H.D Mahavidyalay, Chhatia, graced this occasion as the Chief Speaker-cum-Resource Person whereas Prof Proamod Kumar Khandai, Administrative Bursar and H.O.D of Sociology acted as the Chief Guest. Prof. Dr Ambika Tripathy, Head of the Department of English, presided over the seminar.


After performance of a devotional opening song at 11am, the guests lighted the candles of wisdom and took their seats.

H.O.D of English Dr Ambika Tripathy introduced the guests citing their academic career and creative skills. Prof Proamod Kumar Khandai, Chief Guest in his address, emphasized on quality teaching and learning and highlighted on the relevance of knowledge and its value in the pursuit of knowledge. Prof Gitanjali Mohanty, a faculty member introduced the topic and highlighted about Indian Righters in English in post-colonial era. She also synopsised the post-colonial trades at that time. The danger of power in the hands of the undeserved and the consequences portrate by R K Narayan is brefly narrated by Pro. Mohanty. Sri Gyana Ranjam Mallik, a student of +3 3rd year Hons, presented a modest paper on the topic. After few interactions, Prof. TusharKanti threw a deep insight into the topic; discussed the salient features of post-colonial era, in connection to the topic.
